 - Also check [Oaister](#) which is a union catalog of millions of electronic records, and open access resources
 - From Tutorials select [OPEN SOURCES](#) to learn how to search Opendoar, Oaister and other free access academic information.
16. Where can I find images for my power point presentation?

 - Then select [EBSCO Academic Search Premier](#) to research your topic, selecting “Black and White Photograph”, “Color Photograph”, “Diagram” from search options, after selecting “Choose Databases”

- It will depend on your program, for example in Nursing I will check the institutions, organizations, directories, associations, societies, etc. compiled in [Online Resources: Nursing](#); for Health Science [Online Resources: Health Science](#) and for Education [Online Resources: Education](#)

From EBSCO's site, please scroll down to Business Source Elite and select excel file. <http://www.ebscohost.com/title-lists> . The same procedure for Academic Search Premier, Medline WITH Full Text, CINAHL Plus with Full Text, PsycArticles, ERIC, and Regional Business News.

19. Is there any place I can check my assignments for similarity without actually submitting it? Is there any username and password for this?

For Plagiarism, use **SafeAssign** in Blackboard under **Research Resources**. No user name & password needed.
